❖ ***Dental Hygienist*** - A person who is trained and licensed, cleans teeth and does dental x-rays.

➤ **Working Conditions**

- Clean well- lighted offices
- Wear Protective Attire - scrubs, surgical masks, gloves, safety glasses
- Exposed to diseases and infections - Some patients might come in with a cold or some time of virus going around and it infects them.
- Exposed to radiation - They do most of the dental x-rays.
- Moving positions - They sit in an awkward and uncomfortable positions to reach the patient's teeth.

➤ **Salary:**

- Per year: \$61,955 - \$82,166
- Hourly: \$30 - \$40
- Salary ranges can vary widely depending on many factors including education, certifications, additional skills, number of years you have spent in your profession.

➤ **Training and the Education Required**

- Get an undergraduate degree - Dental hygienists hold an associates degree. A 2-4 year program.
- Get licensed - Must be licensed in all the states in the U.S.
- You may consider an advanced degree - Some may consider going into bachelors and masters degree to further themselves.

➤ Work- Life Balance

- Flexible Schedule - Part time or full time, holidays off, weekends off.
- Stressful vs. Non stressful
- Spending the day interacting with coworkers and patients - Educate patient on flossing and cleaning their teeth.

➤ Current Demand

- Employment of Dental Hygienists is expected to increase by 38% between 2010 and 2020, faster than average.
- Plus they will also be in demand because people will always need their teeth to be cleaned.

❖ **Fashion Design**

- Median annual wage of salary is \$67,420
- Training in sewing & design needed
- Education: Bachelor's Degree in fashion Design or fashion merchandising
- Many fashion Designers work in-house for wholesale or manufacturers
- Some work in design studios or offices
- Designers work many hours to prepare for fashion shows
- They adjust their workday to their clients' schedules & deadlines
- It's projected to grow 3% from 2016 to 2026, slower than average
- Also, a lot of traveling due to their fashion shows

❖ **Business Management**

- Salary: \$122,090
- Education: associates degree, bachelor's degree, & master's Degree
- Training needed in a sales or any other related position for at least 2 years
- Work in offices
- Most work for about 40 hours a week and sometimes overtime work is required
- The current demand depends on the growth of the business. If the business is hardly growing, there won't be a high demand for a business manager and if it's going rapidly, demand will increase.

❖ **Police Officer**

- Salary: \$62,760
- Training & Education: The minimum requirement is a highschool diploma, but you will have a higher chance of getting a job in this field if you go to college for at least 1 or 2 years. You must also pass the law enforcement entrance exam and graduate from the police academy. In the police academy, there are 4 modules that will be taught. These 4 modules are police strategy (legal knowledge, procedure apprehension and arrest), weapons training (how to use tasers, firearms and mace), community collaboration and aide (volunteer in the community and learn CPR) and finally mental toughness (learn how to control your emotions and thought process during a dangerous/scary situation).

- Working Conditions: Officers usually work full-time hours, long days and can be called into work at anytime of the day even if it is their day off, they are still expected to show up.
- Work Life Balance: An officer works at least 40 duty hours per week, each being about 8 hour shifts.
- Current Demand: The current demand for officers is expected to grow 7% in the next 8 years.

❖ **Pilot** - There are many different types of pilots. There are airline pilots, commercial pilots, private pilots, international airline pilots, etc.

Training and Education

1. Research pilot school - To pick the best match for you.
2. Take an Introductory Training Flight Lesson - To get better sense of what it is like to fly behind controls.
3. Apply for FAA Medical Certificate - Pilots must meet medical requirements to fly.
4. Apply For FAA Student Pilot Certificate - You need to fly solo for training.
5. Start Flight Training Lessons - You will need about 1,500 hour of flight training.
6. Pass Private Pilot Knowledge Test
7. Pass Private Pilot Practical Exam

It takes about a year or two to earn a flight instructor certificate to become a pilot.

Salary

Pilots in the U.S. typically start out making an hourly rate of \$20 - \$50. About \$20,000 to \$40,000 per year, depending on the airline, type of aircraft and the pilots experience level.

Working Conditions

- Exposed to distracting sounds

Work- Life Balance

They fly up to 75 to 100 hours a month. They fly all over the world, some spend a fair amount of time on the road and some work over time that they don't even have time for their families.

Current Demand

Expected to grow 3% from 2016 to 2026
