

The Military

- There is six branches of military including Air force, National guard, Coast guard, Marine corps, Navy, and the Infantry
- The Coast guard, Marine corps, and Navy mainly deal with aquatis based operations
- Air force and some of the Navy deal with airborne operations
- The Marine corps, Infantry, and National guard deal with land based operations
- The Military can be used as a way to pay for college but people looking for a more permanent position may seek an officer position and work the way up the chain of command if they desire
- Enlisted persons may learn real world skills based on which corp of the Military they choose
- Officers get a higher salary and a more permanent position in their respected branches
- In the Air force you may also take on a position to defend the nation's cybersecurity
- Both Coast guard and the national guard deal with problems concerning their home state but can be called on to for support in the event of a national emergency

Requirements

- In order to enlist you must be 18 years of age
- In order to become an officer in the army you must be at least 18-27 years of age (different branches have different age requirements)
- In order to enlist in the army you must be a legal resident
- In order to become an officer be a U.S. citizen
- For becoming both enlisted and becoming an officer you must have a physical exam and a high school diploma (some branches will accept a GED)
- One more requirement in order to become officer is you need a minimum of a bachelor degree
- You must also be in good health
- You may also earn an officer commission through Officer candidate school (OCS), Reserve Officers Training Corps (ROTC), A direct commission from the enlisted ranks, Certain legal, medical, or clergy professions

DO YOU HAVE WHAT IT TAKES?

- Whether you're planning on joining as an officer or a member of the enlisted corps, there are a few requirements that must be met before you can join the military.
- These requirements can vary depending on which branch you're interested in, but there are a few requirements that are standard, no matter whether you're joining the Army, Air Force, Navy, Marine Corps or Coast Guard.
